T-shirt details

The T-shirts are deep brown heather, the color chosen by the Classes of 2023 and 2024. Click on the links below for a photo and description of each T-shirt. Below the photo is another link for the "product spec sheet," which describes the fabric and fit, etc.

<u>Women's V-neck</u>: It's recommended that you choose one size larger than usual for the V-neck. Or choose the men's T-shirt, which offers a wider fit. Cost per shirt is \$20 for small and medium; \$21 for large; \$22 for XL; \$24 for XXL; and \$27 for XXXL.

<u>Men's crew neck</u>: Cost per shirt is \$17 for medium; \$18 for large and XL; \$20 for XXL; and \$22 for XXXL.

Hoodie details

<u>Hoodie</u>: The hoodies are available in charcoal heather with a full zipper. The hoodies are available in men's sizes only. Cost per hoodie is \$38
